Combined Higher Secondary Level (CHSL) Examination

The SSC CHSL examination consists of three tiers:

Tier-I: Preliminary Examination

English Language: Basic knowledge of English.

General Intelligence: Logical and analytical reasoning.

Quantitative Aptitude: Mathematics and numerical abilities.

General Awareness: Questions on current events and everyday observations.

Tier-II: Descriptive Paper

This is a pen-and-paper mode examination that includes writing an essay or a letter/application.

Tier-III: Skill Test/Typing Test

For certain posts, skill tests or typing tests may be required.

Junior Engineer (JE) Examination

The SSC JE examination is for recruitment to various engineering posts and consists of two papers:

Paper-I:

General Intelligence and Reasoning: Analytical and logical abilities.

General Awareness: Current events and general knowledge.

Part-A: General Engineering (Civil & Structural) OR Part-B: General Engineering (Electrical) OR Part-C: General Engineering (Mechanical): Questions related to the specific engineering discipline.

Paper-II:

This is a conventional type paper that assesses the candidate's engineering skills and knowledge in the chosen discipline.

Multi-Tasking Staff (MTS) Examination

The SSC MTS examination consists of two papers:

Paper-I:

General Intelligence & Reasoning: Analytical and logical abilities.

Numerical Aptitude: Basic mathematics.

General English: Basic knowledge of English.

General Awareness: Questions on current events and general knowledge.

Paper-II:

This is a descriptive paper, including short essay or letter writing.
